UNIVERSAL SCREENING

K-2 universal screening for reading difficulties, including risk of dyslexia



IT'S OFFICIAL

On July 10, 2023, Governor Newsom signed the Education Omnibus Budget Trailer Bill (**Senate Bill 114**) which included K-2 universal screening for reading difficulties, including risk of dyslexia.

BACKGROUND

Research from multiple scientific studies is unequivocal: early identification and intervention improves literacy outcomes for students at risk of, or with, dyslexia and other struggling readers. K-2 universal screening makes system-wide early intervention possible and is the first step in closing academic gaps, before students fall behind.

SB 114 KEY POINTS

- require schools to conduct K-2
 annual universal screenings for
 reading difficulties, including risk of
 dyslexia, and provide evidence-based
 literacy instruction, progress
 monitoring, and early intervention in
 the regular general education
 program for students at risk
- include screening instruments that are developed both for Englishspeaking pupils and for non-English speaking pupils, in languages reflecting the primary languages of pupils in the state

Task

State Board of Education develops evaluation criteria and appoints a panel of independent experts

Independent expert panel approves a list of selected screening instruments

Local education agencies (LEAs) formally adopt screener(s) from the approved list

No later than 2025-2026 school year LEAs begin annual K-2 screening with results shared with parents/guardians no later than 45 days from date of screening
