What is dyslexia?

Dyslexia is a language-based learning disability. Individuals with dyslexia have trouble with reading, writing and spelling. These difficulties are not related to intellectual ability or lack of education. Individuals with dyslexia can learn to read, write and spell but often need specialized instruction to develop these skills and reach their potential.

You may have dyslexia if you...

- · Read slowly and with much effort (but are often the one to solve the problem)
- Have difficulty with spelling and have messy handwriting (but your writing shows terrific imagination)
- · Have trouble remembering dates and names (but you grasp the "big picture" and demonstrate "out-of-box" thinking)


